Gardiner Scholarship Program (formally known as PLSA)

For Students with specific disabilities to attend a Florida Private School or a Home education Program


Your child may qualify for a scholarship with one or more of the following disabilities:

(as defined in statue 1002.385)

- 1. Autism Spectrum Disorder
- 2. Down Syndrome
- 3. Cerebral Palsy
- 4. Intellectual Disability
- 5. Prader-Willi Syndrome
- 6. Phelan-McDermid

- 7. Spina Bifida
- 8. Williams Syndrome
- 9. Muscular Dystrophy
- 10. A student in Kindergarten being a high-risk child
- 11. Dual sensory impaired
- 12. Anaphylaxis
- 13.Deaf
- 14. Visually Impaired
- 15. Traumatic brain injured
- 16.Rare diseases
- 17. Hopsital or homebound

In order to qualify for the Scholarship:



- A student entering Kindergarten must be 5 years old on or before September 1st, OR
- A student entering 1st grade must be 6 years old on or before September 1st, AND
- You must be a Florida resident, AND
- A student must have a written diagnosis from a licensed physician or psychologist that identifies the qualifying disabilities, **AND**
- The student may be enrolled in a private school or a home education program.



- Continue to attend a Florida public school, including:
 - o Florida School for the Deaf and the Blind
 - Florida Virtual School (as a public school student)
 - o College-Preparatory Boarding Academy
 - o A developmental research school
 - A district Charter school
 - A district virtual education program (as a public school student)
- Receive a McKay Scholarship or a Tax Credit (Income-Based)
 Scholarship.
- Enroll in a school operating for the purpose of providing educational services to youth in the Department of Juvenile Justice commitment programs.
