5. How do you regularly monitor and evaluate student learning, and what do you do if students are struggling?
6. How do you choose your curriculum and textbooks? Do you have a specific approach?
7. Do your teachers use a specific instructional strategy or method?
8. Can you tell me about the classes and activities you offer?
9. How do you foster an environment of mutual respect between students, teachers, and parents?
10. What is your school's approach to keeping students safe and preventing bullying?
11. What are your school's policies related to diversity and inclusion?
12. What is your school's approach to homework and testing?
