Florida Private School Scholarships


Applications are now available to help pay for your child to attend an eligible private school of your choice!



If your child is in a school that is not meeting his/her needs, we may have the help you need!

Your child may qualify for a scholarship of up to \$7,000+ per year to attend a Florida private school if:


1. The child resides in Florida and is entering Kindergarten through 12th Grade





2022- 2023 Household Income/Financial Resources Table - Florida

- 1. Household size: count all the people who live in your household (regardless of their relationship to you); this is your household size.
- Household income: add together ALL the 2021 annual earnings and assistance (taxable and non-taxable) for everyone in the household; this is your household income.
- **3.** Use these two numbers to look at the chart below. Your household income must be at or below the listed value for your household size in order to apply.





NOTE: If a student is found eligible for both Florida income-based scholarship programs**, AAA will grant them an FTC scholarship. *Exceptions to the income requirement include military dependents, children in foster and out-of home care, Law Enforcement &	Household Size	Maximum Household Income for an AAA Scholarship

^{**}Currently, there are two State-

approved Florida income-based scholarship programs: the Florida Tax Credit Scholarship ("FTC") and the Family Empowerment Scholarship for Educational Options ("FES-EO"). FES-EO scholarships are government-funded. The FES-EO award amount actually funded may be reduced by the State. FTC scholarships are privately-funded from donations made to AAA Scholarship Foundation, a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization.
