



## **Kindergarten – 12th Grade Scholarships**

# Arizona Private School Scholarships

Applications will be available in *mid-March* for your child to attend an eligible private school of your choice



If your child is in a school that is not meeting his/her needs, we may have the help you need.

## Your child may qualify for a scholarship to a private school if:

1. He/She attended at least 90 days at an Arizona public school during the 2023-24 school year.

**OR** 

He/She is entering Kindergarten for the 2024-2025 school year.

OR

He/She was homeschooled for the 2023-24 school year or moved to AZ from another state in 2023-24.

OR

He/She is transferring from another Scholarship Tuition Organization (STO) or the Arizona Empowerment Scholarship Account (ESA)

OR

He/She is a dependent of a military member stationed in Arizona.

#### AND

2. Your household income is at or below the amount shown on the chart:



### 2024- 2025 Household Income/Financial Resources Eligibility Table - Arizona

- Household size: count all the people who live in your household (regardless of their relationship to you); this is your household size.
- 2. Household income: add together ALL the 2023 annual gross earnings and assistance (taxable and non-taxable) for everyone in the household; this is your household income.
- 3. Use these two numbers to look at the chart below. Your household income must be at or below the listed value for your household size in order to apply.

**Note**: Any business losses will be adjusted to zero, and therefore the total income will be adjusted accordingly to determine household eligibility.



Household size	Maximum 2023 Household Income for an AAA Arizona Scholarship
1	\$51,543
2	\$69,956
3	\$88,369
4	\$106,782
Each additional	\$18,413

NOTE: All eligible AAA scholarship students will be granted scholarships up to the maximum values allowed by law for their grade level:

K - 8<sup>th</sup> = \$6,300 9<sup>th</sup> - 12<sup>th</sup> = \$8,100

Your child must be accepted by an eligible private school under their normal admissions policy. Students must follow all academic and discipline policies of the individual school. Schools are free to dismiss students who do not comply.
